Announcement of Certificate Course in Heritage Management (12^h Aug- 6th Sep 2024)

The Wildlife Institute of India is a premier national institute for training, research and advisory services in the field of wildlife conservation and management. The Institute hosts the world's first centre on natural heritage conservation named Wildlife Institute of India - Category 2 Centre (WII-C2C) for World Natural Heritage Management and Training for Asia and the Pacific Region, under the auspices of UNESCO. The WII-C2C is offering a 4-week residential Certificate Course in Heritage Management (CCHM) beginning 12th August, 2024. This short course will equip the officer trainees in attendance with a functional understanding of the core principles and theory of heritage and the ability to incorporate the same into their management plans making them robust and future-ready. The interlinking between the natural and cultural domains of heritage will also be examined throughout this course. The course is developed to serve the needs of the personnel of current and potential natural heritage sites of India, including staff of forest department of the rank of Assistant Conservator of Forest (ACF) and Deputy Conservator of Forest (DCF) or their equivalent from other departments in India within maximum age of 45 years. Heritage professionals from other institutions and organisations may also be potential participants on payment basis and availability of seats. Capacity of the course is up to 15 participants for this fully residential programme.
