Reference is invited to the letter of the Chief Wildlife Warden, Chhattisgarh No. WL/Mgmt/17/2582 dated 6th May 2017, seeking this Ministry's approval for radio-collaring of 12 Elephants in Chhattisgarh, over a period of two years 2017 and 2018 under the collaborative Project on 'Conservation Management of Elephants in Chhattisgarh: Capacity building initiative on dispersal and ranging patterns of elephants for effective management of Human Elephant interactions'.

In this context, the undersigned is directed to convey the approval in accordance with proviso under Section 12 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for radio-collaring of 12 Elephants, in phases over a period of two years (2017 and 2018) under the collaborative project on 'on 'Conservation Management of Elephants in Chhattisgarh: Capacity building initiative on dispersal and ranging patterns of elephants for effective management of Human Elephant interactions', subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The Chief Wildlife Warden shall ensure and satisfy himself that the entire operation is carried out in a safe manner to the Elephants.
- (ii) The capture and subsequent radio-collaring of the Elephants shall be undertaken by qualified veterinarian and strictly under the supervision of the State Forest Department. Adequate veterinary care will also be ensured at all stages of capture, radio-collaring and subsequent release of the Elephants.

(iii) It should be ensured that minimum trauma is caused to the Elephants during the entire operation.

- (iv) There would be regular monitoring during and after the radio collaring process by the Chief Wildlife Warden/State Forest Department and regular periodic report will be submitted by the Chief Wildlife Warden to
- (v) In case of any mis-happening during the process, that endangers or may endanger the safety of the Elephants, the Ministry may review/revoke the permission given.

The Chief Wildlife Warden may take further action in the matter accordingly.
